

Cathy Duffy runs a review website and I recently consulted it because I was unhappy with two of my resources. I ended up buying this book and I was so glad I did. In fact, I wished I had read it a long time ago. It wasn't just valuable because of the reviews, but also because it stepped me through teaching styles, learning styles, philosophies of schooling, etc. all the while helping me define my own situation and desires. Then, she shows you which resources she thinks will work best for your desires and rates them on things like prep time, teacher involvement, cost, etc. It really is a great resource!

There are as many ways to homeschool as there are homeschoolers. Duffy's book gives an overview of each of the most popular philosophies. She also provides provoking questions and an

inventory to help you find where your family fits in. The curriculum review portion of the book is also a great place to start looking at curriculum, if you go that route. I think her book is perfect for most new homeschoolers because it's a book that gives you an overview of the philosophies. Then you can get to the internet to look more deeply into any that spur your interest.
