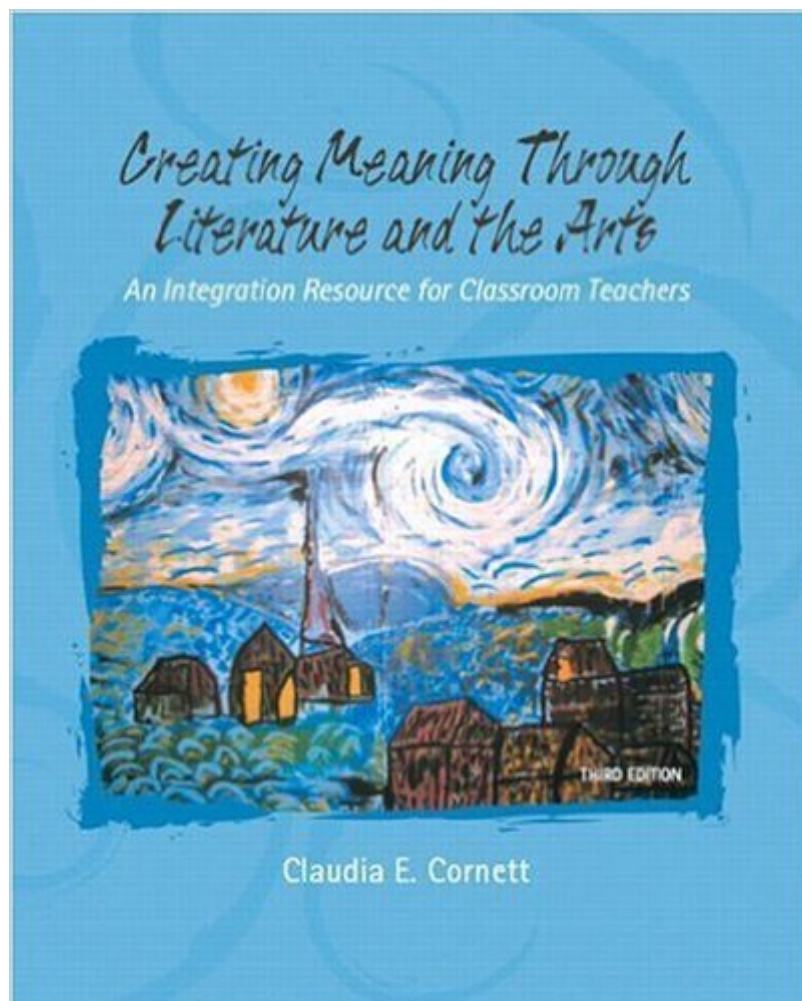


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# Creating Meaning Through Literature And The Arts: An Integrated Resource For Classroom Teachers (3rd Edition)
