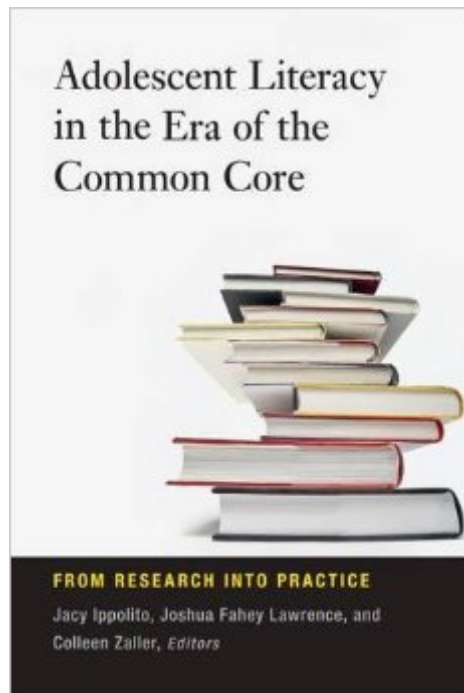

I stumbled upon this book In my quest to gain some perspective on the latest research on adolescent literacy. I found it to be incredibly informative and well-written; I read it cover- to-cover in

one sitting. The editors invited practitioners and researchers to collaboratively weigh in on current debates in literacy and I found the balance between theory and practice, research and reality refreshing and accessible. The editors did not dumb down the complexity of teaching literacy to "best practices" but rather organize the information into what the editors called six essential domains: discipline literacy, vocabulary, discussion, digital literacy, multiple texts, writing-to-learn. As a practitioner (literacy director in an urban public school) I found that this book gave me the language I needed to talk about my work and the organizing framework to critically assess our school's literacy program. It did what it was designed to do: be a "signal in the noise" in the current flood of information on adolescent literacy. Thank you to the editors and contributors on a job well done!

I highly recommend this book as a useful resource for secondary education instructors who hope to not only align their practices with Common Core Standards, but also advance literacy among their adolescent students. The book espouses a process wherein teachers "apprentice" their students into the habits of mind of the discipline--highlighting the specific demands of disciplinary texts, focusing on relevant vocabulary/discourse skills, utilizing multiple texts that require synthesis and deeper analysis, and other domains. It is a helpful reference tool, and one I will keep with me as a beginning teacher to ensure I am merging content and literacy instruction consistently so that students build the requisite conceptual knowledge as they work to improve their literacy in the classroom.

Fantastic book! It provides strategies in fostering literacy across all disciplines. Very relevant to current classrooms; and helpful for both new and veteran teachers. The book aligns its research to Common Core Standards by addressing literacy, multiple texts, discussion, vocabulary etc. As a math teacher, I found it very helpful in guiding lessons in order to achieve higher amounts of content literacy. The material is well thought out, the research is highly reliable and relevant, there are numerous examples that are easily comparable to the Common Core standards, and the pages are filled with all sorts of ideas to give any educator the tools that he or she needs in order to get a grasp of what adolescent literacy is all about and how to apply it immediately in the classroom. Additionally, the chapters are also set up in an easy to follow way: research is presented in one while practical examples follow in the next.

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
